

FIREARM SAFE REBATE PROGRAM

In response to Utah House Bill 17 – Firearm Violence and Suicide Prevention Amendments, the Utah Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health (DSAMH), in conjunction with the Bureau of Criminal Identification (BCI), is offering a limited, one-time rebate for one firearm safe. The rebate is valid for up to 50% of the pre-tax sales amount, not to exceed \$100.00.

This amendment supports the Utah Suicide Prevention Coalition's "[IS YOUR SAFETY ON?](#)" campaign and its efforts to reduce suicide deaths by firearms. Eighty-six percent of firearm deaths in Utah are suicides and Utah ranks fifth in the nation in suicide deaths. Putting time and distance between a person at risk of suicide and a firearm may save a life. Together we can protect our family and friends. A firearm safe is defined as:

1. A gun safe, gun case, lock box, or other device;
2. Is designed to fully contain one or more firearms;
3. Has the ability to be securely locked and unlocked by means of a key, combination, or other similar means; and
4. Excludes glass and/or wooden gun cabinets.

Requirements:

1. Be a Utah resident.
2. Applied for, renewed, or currently hold a Concealed Firearm Permit.
3. Complete an online firearm safe rebate application.
4. Valid email.

Important Limitations: Issue of a rebate number does not guarantee the rebate will be available. Rebates will be issued until the funding is exhausted, and will be honored first-come first-serve, with completed and correct submissions. Rebate tracking numbers expire 30 days after the date of issue. Limit of one rebate to each Concealed Firearm Permit (CFP) holder.
